WHAT is *Safe at Home*?

The Secretary of State's *Safe at Home* program is an address confidentiality program. It allows survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault or stalking to receive mail using the Secretary of State's address as a substitute for their own, while keeping their actual address confidential.

Substitute Address

The *Safe at Home* program assigns participants a substitute address that can be used with all city, county, and state offices as well as with private organizations that require a mailing address. Your physical address will not appear on public records.

Mail Forwarding Service

First-class mail will be securely handled and forwarded to the participant's confidential address.

Confidential Voter Registration

Participants can register to vote without having their information posted on the public voter registration list. Participation in the *Safe at Home* program allows eligible voters to apply to vote as an absentee voter.

Who is ELIGIBLE for *Safe at Home*?

Participants in the Secretary of State's *Safe at Home* program are:

- Residents of New Mexico
- Survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, attempted sexual assault, or stalking

How do I APPLY for the *Safe at Home* program?
